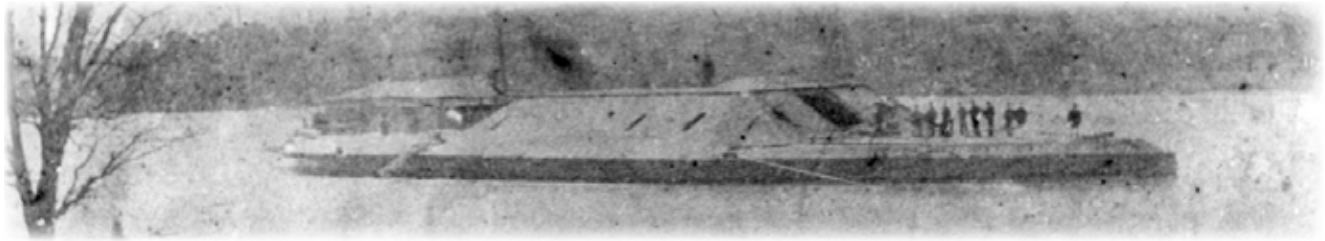

John Coski

John Coski is the Historian of the Museum of the Confederacy, and will discuss the ironclads in the James River Squadron.

Ozzie Raines

Ozzie Raines is a master model builder with work on display at a number of facilities, including Port Columbus. He is currently constructing a model of the CSS Richmond.

Roger Durham

Roger Durham, military historian at Carlsile Barracks, will speak about the role of Union Ironclads and their attack on Ft. McAllister.

Dr. John Quarstein

John Quarstein is the chief advisor and historian for the Monitor project at the Mariner's Museum, and will discuss Hampton Roads, the USS Monitor and the CSS Virginia.

Dr. Gordon Watts

Gordan Watts is a recognized authority on underwater archaeology, and was involved with Monitor, Alabama, and Hunley recovery project. He will discuss the CSS Georgia.
